The ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge (ALL IN) is a national, nonpartisan initiative of Civic Nation launched in 2016 that supports and recognizes nearly 1,000 colleges and universities across the nation working to improve nonpartisan democratic engagement - defined as civic learning, political engagement, and voter participation.



STATE VOTING CHALLENGES

ALL IN supported 22 <u>state and city campus voting</u> <u>challenges</u>, including 8 in partnership with the respective Secretary of State offices.

ALL IN is supporting state agencies in California, Maryland, and Minnesota in implementing new state laws that require colleges and universities to develop a nonpartisan democratic engagement action plan.

ALL IN expanded programs to recognize **175** Students Voting Honor Roll recipients. We also hosted our 4th biennial <u>Awards Celebration</u> where we were joined by **402** people representing **204** campuses and **60** organizations from **41** states.







COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE

ALL IN prioritized support for Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs) — especially Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSIs) — and Community Colleges through tailored resources, coaching, and other programming. We expanded our communities of practice offering offering tailored support for action planning, local election engagement, and coalition building.

COMMITMENT

We grew the <u>Presidents' Commitment to Full</u> <u>Student Voter Participation</u> by **39** signatories for **624** commitments overall. ATHLETIC CONFERENCE VOTING CHALLENGES

ALL IN actively supports **14** athletic conference voting challenges. In 2023, ALL IN connected athletic conference contacts on a regular basis and set the foundation for continued engagement into 2024.

CAMPUS ACTION PLANNING

ALL IN and its partners coached campuses on developing and implementing data-informed democratic engagement action plans for the 2024 election. Plans are being reviewed and campuses will be provided confidential scores and detailed feedback.

A record, **232** campuses submitted action plans for 2024 by the first submission opportunity in December 2023, a **71%** increase compared to this time for the 2020 election.

NONPARTISAN STUDENT VOTING GROUPS

In 2023, ALL IN released the 3rd edition of the <u>Nonpartisan Student Voting Group</u> <u>Report & Toolkit</u> to support campuses and students to start, grow, and sustain nonpartisan student voting groups. ALL IN is now aware of 174 nonpartisan student voting groups and efforts.

ALL IN TO VOTE

ALL IN to Vote is a free, one-stop shop for campuses and students to navigate the voting process. In 2023, ALL IN supported custom voter registration portals for **70** participating institutions.





OUR IMPACT



Campuses engaged in ALL IN had average 2020 voter turnout rates that were **3.7 percentage points higher** than other campuses.

ALL IN will have data from the 2022 election once the National Study of Learning, Voting & Engagement (NSLVE) reports are released in early 2024.



WHAT DOES THE DATA SHOW ABOUT ALL IN'S IMPACT?



984 participating campuses in ALL IN across all **50** states and Washington, DC, serving more than **9.9 million** students; including **232** Community Colleges, and **256** Minority-Serving Institutions, including **47** Historically Black Colleges & Universities and **158** Hispanic-Serving Institutions.



27% of youth (ages 18-29) cast a ballot in 2022, making this the midterm election with the second-highest youth voter turnout in almost three decades.*

Campuses whose President, Provost, or Chancellor signed ALL IN's <u>Presidents' Commitment to Full Voter Participation</u> had a higher average 2020 voter turnout rate and were more likely to submit an action plan in 2020, 2022, and so far for 2024.

WHAT DOES THE DATA SHOW ABOUT ALL IN'S IMPACT?



ALL IN HBCUs, Hispanic-serving institutions, and community colleges had higher average 2020 voter turnout rates compared to their peers.



Campuses participating in state campus voting challenges and athletic conference voting challenges had higher average 2020 voter turnout rates.

Campuses that have been participating in ALL IN longer and submitting action plans had higher 2020 voter turnout rates.





2024 PRIORITIES



In 2024, ALL IN will:

Focus Support on Minority Serving Institutions and community colleges. Increase breadth & depth of Communities of Practice for HBCUs, HSIs, and community colleges.
