### **Actions to Accomplish**

- Voter Registration
  - Office of Community Engagement will provide weekly drop in opportunities to register in the University Center up till the registration deadline.
  - The Department of Student Engagement will host registration forms for students to access anytime during University operating hours.
  - Campus departments and offices will be encouraged to hold events in partnership with the Cherokee County Election Board to increase voter registration.
  - ADP will hold special voter registration event in partnership with the Cherokee County Election Board for Constitution Day
  - Faculty members are encouraged to provide registration forms and opportunity to register for students.
  - All registrations will be tracked for the Oklahoma State Campus Compact voter registration competition.
  - All registrations will be mailed for the student at the expense the Office of Community Engagement.
- Voter Education
  - Office of Community Engagement will publicise the Oklahoma Online Voter Tool for students to access information about their election board, polling station,
  - Office of Community Engagement will host a Presidential Debate Watch party for the first debate of the election cycle.

- Political Science faculty will present nonpartisan information about the state questions on the ballot.
- A Forum on the state ballot questions will be held for campus community.
- The creation or utilization of a state question digest resource will be provided to the campus community.
- Ballot Access
  - Office of Community Engagement will work closely with the Cherokee County Election Board in order to ensure proper information is shared for voter eligibility and protocol for in-person and absentee ballot voting.
- Get Out the Vote
  - ADP members will encourage early and day of voting.
  - Campus wide announcement with information on polling location, hours, and proper protocol will be distributed.

### **After The Election Possible Activities**

- Office of Community Engagement in collaboration with the Division of Student Affairs will provide an Election Night Watch Party.
- ADP and campus Partners hold a Results Forum for campus community to discuss the election cycle and results in a civil manner
- ADP will share NLSV data with campus.
- ADP will examine NLSV data for any connections to the Campus Compact Civic Action Plan creation and publication to further strengthen the institutions civic engagement work.
- ADP will consider hosting a series of workshops in spring on how the results of the election will affect the industries students are entering for employment.
- ADP will work in partnership with the Cherokee County Election Board in providing information on registration, deadlines, and voting for local elections in the spring semester.
