# **Executive Summary**

The Bowling Green State University C. Raymond Marvin Center for Student Leadership has recently undertaken BGSU Votes, an initiative dedicated to increasing students' political engagement and civic learning since 2012 at Bowling Green State University. Through a variety of on campus partnerships with Residence Life, Undergraduate Student Government, Department of Political Science and off campus partnerships such as the Wood County Board of Elections, Bowling Green League of Women Voters, the Andrew Goodman Foundation, Campus Vote Project, All In Campus Democracy Challenge, and the National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE), a strong foundation has been established to increase capacity for more political engagement and participation at BGSU. Based on NSLVE data, our student voter participation for 2020 showed an increase of 11.9 percentage points since the 2016 general election and BGSU was recognized as a Silver Campus by the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge with an overall voting participation rate of 67.6% in 2020, which is 1.6 percentage points higher than the national institutional voting average. In 2021, BGSU received the Voter Friendly Campus Designation from Campus Vote Project for demonstrating the ways BGSU strives to institutionalize the voting process.

# Leadership

The BGSU Votes Leadership Team is led by the staff and student leaders of the Civic Engagement Department within the C. Raymond Marvin Center for Student Leadership and Civic Engagement. Additionally, the BGSU Votes team has recruited volunteers in order to reach more students on campus, as well as to maintain a plan for leadership succession.

## **Statistics**

- Engaged with approximately **712** people during Fall 2021
- Engaged with approximately **404** people during Spring 2022
- Completed over **50** voter registration forms during Fall 2022
- Completed **51** voter registration forms during Spring 2022
- This means during the 2021-2022 academic year, BGSU Votes engaged with over **1,100** students, faculty, and community members and registered over **100** people to vote

- Voting Rates
  - o BGSU's 2020 NSLVE data shows that our voting rate was **67.6%**, which is an 11.9% increase from the 2016 Presidential Election; this is also 1.6% higher than the national average of other institutions
- Voting Methods
  - o Early voting increased 2% since 2016
  - o In-person voting rates on Election Day increased by 1% since 2016
  - o Absentee voting increased by 10% since 2016
  - The most common voting method in 2020 was absentee voting due to the pandemic

# Volunteering/Thompson Voter Engagement Team

- The Thompson Voter Engagement Team was created in Spring 2022 in a collaboration between the Thompson Family Scholars and BGSU Votes
- There are about 12 volunteers, but we would like to increase this number in the Fall semester
- This group completed a total of over 40 volunteer hours in Spring 2022
