Executive Summary:

This nonpartisan democratic engagement action plan was developed by California State University, Long Beach in California for the 2024 general election. The purpose of this action plan is to fulfill a comprehensive civic engagement plan for our university including to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter registration, voter education and mobilization, and support students' overall wellness as it relates to approaching and processing the election.

The goals for California State University, Long Beach for the 2022 election are:

- 1) Engage the campus community around local races, especially that for our City of Long Beach City Council, District 4 seat.
- Register students and other university stakeholders to vote and better engage them through the California Ballot Bowl competition.
- Create new collaborative engagement efforts across the university in order to educate, engage, and support the mental health and wellness of those navigating an election season.

Commitment:

This year we created a collaborative multi-stakeholder group to create a four-part civic engagement plan: Voter Registration, Voter Engagement and Mobilization, Election Preparedness, and Election Response. Students and administrators are working in

coordination to support and engage students around civic engagement through various activities within student government, the dream success center, the multi cultural center, the dean of students office, housing and residence life, the counseling and psychological services center, and the league of women voters. This group meets biweekly.

California State University, Long Beach has been a signatory to the Higher Education Presidents' Commitment to Full Student Voter Participation since 2022.

Landscape:

California State University, Long Beach is a public 4-year institution and joined the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge in 2020. Our institution is the following: Minority Serving Institution, Hispanic-Serving Institution, Asian Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution.

Goals:

Our campus democratic engagement goals are:

Goal 1: Increase voter engagement through awareness and registration. While no specific target was set, we did establish the goal of winning the 2024 Ballot Bowl in California, a competition among other state institutions. To date, we are leading this effort statewide.

Goal 2: Host a Long Beach District 4 council candidate forum, scheduled for October 4, 2024.

Goal 3: Establish a schedule of election preparedness resources through the Dean of Students and AVP for Student Engagement offices.

Goal 4: Establish a set of election response resources for students through the AVP for Student Health and Wellness office

Strategy:

California State University, Long Beach will implement these strategies to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter participation.

- 1. Host a mayoral forum.
- 2. Coordinate a voter engagement and registration program.

3. Market the General Election and voter registration campaign to the student body through various communication channels.

Evaluation:

We will evaluate our action plan in the following ways:

- 1. Documenting our voter registration date through Ballot Bowl metrics.
- 2. Recording the among of pre- and post-election resources, events, and other activities provided through our collaborative team.
- 3. Post-election, we will conduct a qualitative review of how election resources were received, attended, and how students' mental health was addressed following the election through those particular activities.
