Concord University Voter Engagement Activities

Several Concord University student organizations have worked throughout the year to improve civic engagement generally and electoral participation specifically. *Pi Sigma Alpha*, the political science honor society, has partnered with both the College Republican and Young Democrats in cross-, bi-, and non-partisan efforts to improve engagement. Those efforts have included an April "Pizza and Politics" event, moderated by students, that featured presentations, questions, and answers from dozens of candidates for state and federal office; approximately one hundred students and community members attended this pre-primary forum. The organizations also partnered to promote Concord's Constitution Day event (see attached).

Additionally, many members of all three aforementioned organizations are active in Concord's Student Government Association (SGA) and, individually, in partisan campaigns. As both members of student government and in volunteer and professional campaign roles, student leaders have encouraged their fellow students to register to vote (see the attached press release regarding the Bonner Scholars voter registration drive, which was supported by the SGA).

Finally, we anticipate post-election events, including a meeting with the Hope College Voter Registration and Engagement Project Initiative, headed by the Reverend Matthew J. Watts.
