WHAT IS ALL IN?

The ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge is a national, nonpartisan initiative that supports and recognizes colleges and universities working to strengthen civic learning, voter participation, and ongoing engagement in our democracy. ALL IN encourages institutions to help students form the habits of active and informed citizenship, as well as institutionalize civic engagement activities and programs — making them a defining feature of campus life.

Together, we are cultivating generations of engaged citizens and community members who are essential to a healthy, representative democracy in particular by supporting low propensity voters. HBCUs engaged in ALL IN reported higher civic learning on campus and had 2022 voter turnout rates that were 3 percentage points higher. Black students at ALL IN campuses had voting rates 4 percentage points higher than their peers at non-ALL IN campuses.
