With nearly 730,000 college students in Illinois, college student voters in the state play an important role in local, state, and national elections.

45 participating campuses

- 24 public institutions
- 21 private institutions
- 29 4-year institutions
- 14 2-year institutions

- 13 Hispanic Serving Institutions
- 4 Predominantly Black Institutions

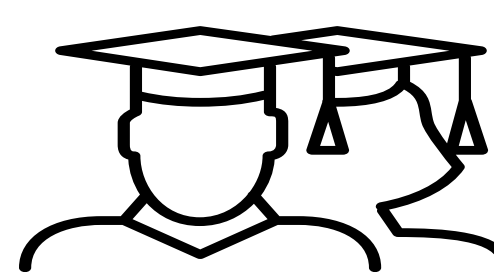

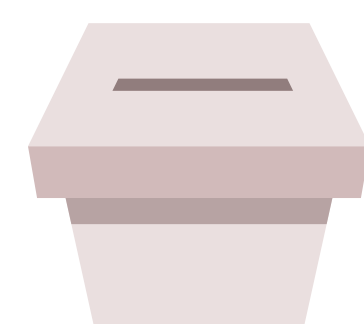
