Executive Summary:

This nonpartisan democratic engagement action plan was developed by Lebanon Valley College in Pennsylvania for the 2024 election. The purpose of this action plan is to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter registration, education, and turnout in the 2024 election. The goals for Lebanon Valley College for the 2024 election are: 1) to register or register 100 students and 2) to contact 50% of students through classroom visits.

Lebanon Valley College is a private 4-year institution and joined the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge in 2016. Our institution is designated as the following: Predominantly White Institution. Rural Serving Institution.

Our campus demographic and voting data:

Lebanon Valley College has 1,959 students.

Lebanon Valley College has authorized the National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE) and will receive campus voting data for the 2022 election in fall 2023. However, our NSLVE authorization expires in 2023 and our institution will need to reauthorize NSLVE to receive campus voting data for the 2024 election and beyond.

We have not received our 2022 data.

Lebanon Valley College participates in the following initiatives to support the development and implementation of our nonpartisan democratic engagement efforts on campus: National Voter Registration Day (2018).

Goals:

Our institution's nonpartisan democratic engagement goals are:

We will evaluate our action plan in the following ways:

We will collect material on numbers of students who saw presentations.

Lebanon Valley College will use the National, Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement to evaluate the increase of student voting by comparing our campus voter turnout and voter registration rates to past elections to measure progress on increasing both.
