

Long Beach City College 2020 Democratic Engagement Action Plan Developed by: Kim Hamon

Executive Summary:

An action plan was created through collaboration with the Director of Student Life, Nevon Watson, Student Activities Advisor-LTE, Kim Hamon, Career Center Coordinator, Ann Marie Nunag. We worked together to create a Civic Engagement 101 session with the Los Angeles County Registrar to encourage students to vote as well as become a poll worker. We also had a National Voter Registration Day social media campaign, and a social media campaign for Constitution Day, ending with a screening of the documentary, The 13th. This action plan sought to accomplish higher voter registration rates from LBCC students, and encouragement to be more civically engaged. This action plan started Fall 2020, and will continue throughout the entirety of the November election.
