With over 60,000 college students in Maine, college student voters in the state play an important role in local, state, and national elections.

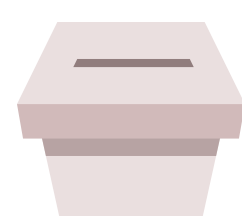
