Executive Summary:

This nonpartisan democratic engagement action plan was developed by Minnesota North College in Minnesota for the 2024 election. This action plan covers the Hibbing, Itasca, Mesabi Range Virginia, Mesabi Range Eveleth, Rainy River, and Vermilion campuses. The purpose of this action plan is to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter registration, education, and turnout in the 2024 election. The goals for Minnesota North College for the 2024 election are: Collaborate and empower students, faculty and staff at each campus to strengthen voter registration, education & participation. More specifically to Increase the college-wide student voter participation average by 2% (50 students).

President Michael Raich is a current signatory to the ALL IN Presidents' Commitment to Full Student Voter Participation most recently signing the commitment in 2022.

Landscape:

Minnesota North College is a public community college and joined the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge in 2019. While more diverse than the communities we serve, we still are a predominantly white, rural serving institution.

Our campus demographic and voting data:

College-wide voter participation in the two previous Presidential election cycles were 82% in 2016 and 79% in 2020.

Minnesota North College currently (Fall 2023) has 2,165 students who are of voting age and 3,026 total students. Of those students:

- 365 are considered from "Out of the State"
- 455 are Residential and live on campus

Prospective voters have until 21 days before to election day to register to vote but also are able to register on election day.

Minnesota North College has authorized the National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE) and will receive campus voting data for the 2022 election in fall 2023. Our NSLVE authorization runs through 2033.

Legacy Colleges of Minnesota North College 2016 campus voting rate was 82%. Legacy Colleges of Minnesota North College 2020 campus voting rate was 79%.

Goals:

Our institution's nonpartisan democratic engagement goal is to:

• Increase student voter turnout by 2% in 2024 when compared to the previous Presidential Election Cycle (2020).

Strategy:

Minnesota North College will implement these strategies to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter participation.

- Utilize Constitution Day activities to educate students about the importance of voting
- Host Voter Registration Drives at each campus
- Provide rides to the polls for residential students
- Encourage voter education organizations to have a presence on campus

Evaluation:

We will evaluate our action plan in the following ways:

Minnesota North College will use the National, Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement to evaluate the increase of student voting by comparing our campus voter turnout and voter registration rates to past elections to measure progress on increasing both.

Minnesota North College also participates in the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) bi-annually which measures student engagement and activism on campus.
