New Jersey State Summary



With nearly 400,000 college students in New Jersey, college student voters in the state play an important role in local, state, and national elections.

27 participating campuses

- 18 public institutions
- 9 private institutions
- 22 4-year institutions
- 5 2-year institutions

- 11 Minority Serving Institutions
- 10 Hispanic Serving Institutions
- 3 Asian American Native American Pacific Islander serving institutions


Average voting rate among ALL IN New Jersey campuses in 2020
