- Continue to post election information regarding deadlines, upcoming elections and early voting times and locations
- Continue to offer early voting on our campus
- Have students fill out the Vote Challenge to pledge their commitment to voting
- Have information on registering to vote and opportunities to work on election days on the website
- Have alumni continue to work and vote on election day, and let current students know
- Continue to have the Cook County Clerk's Office as well as other organizations on campus to register students and community
- Signed up students to register to vote on National Voter Registration Day this fall
- Bring awareness to civic holidays like National Voter Education week and Vote Early Day

Seek feedback throughout the action planning process from people outside our taskforce

Revisit our goals, identify goals achieved and not achieved, and adjust them. What are our short term goals, what are our long term goals?
