Executive Summary:

This nonpartisan democratic engagement action plan was developed by Patti Goreman in WA for the 2024 election. The purpose of this action plan is to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter registration, education, and turnout in the 2024 election.

Goals:

Our institution's nonpartisan democratic engagement goals are:

Increase student voter registration and turnout.

Strategy:

One of our Poli Sci profs developed a 3-pronged educational and action plan for winter, spring and (next) fall quarters.

- Also attached is the write-up for spring quarter, an invitation to (competition) to students to express, in any way they like, what democracy means to them.
- We have a GOTV table in the main hallway that has all sorts of info about how to register to vote.

Explanation of Spring Quarter Student Presentations

Whereas the Winter Quarter's meeting was mainly Staff and Faculty led, <u>Spring Quarter's Save Our Democracy meeting will be student led</u>. But for students to lead next quarter's event, we will need the crucial help of faculty and staff.

<u>Assignment Participation</u>. Faculty at each campus, and in our special programs, please look out next quarter for an announcement asking you to adjust an assignment in ways that allow students to meet course requirements while also recognizing the threats to our democracy in this 2024 election.

- An English assignment might allow a poem or essay related to the need to protect our democracy against authoritarianism.
- A math or science problem may call for an answer that includes numbers such as the over 230 years of our federal republic, over 57 successive presidential elections, and 46 different people successfully transitioning into office.
- An apparel design or desktop publishing assignment could include student productions depicting the threats to U.S. democracy.

Each instructor will know how best to adjust an assignment to allow students to participate in this.

Forwarding Student Work to the Campus Committee. In the announcement will be contact information concerning where each instructor can forward, with a student's permission, students' work to your campus *Save Our Democracy* committee. Students, you don't have to wait on your instructor to forward your work. You can forward your work directly to your campus *Save Our*

Democracy committee. Each campus committee will determine how it will award at least 3 student winners, and then each campus committee will, in fact, award those student winners.

Student Prizes. So, what will each winner, on each campus, get? Each winner receives 3 things:

- 1. \$100 book award,
- 2. An award letter from your campus Save Our Democracy Committee for reference on your resume and your college applications, and
- 3. You get to present your work at your campus's Spring Quarter Save Our Democracy event.

Of course, if a student prefers, the student can have a committee member present that student's winning work for the student. Understandably, we want to be respectful to students' needs and wishes.

<u>Your Help is Needed</u>. Picture a Spring Quarter event sometime after week six (6) that is student led. Imagine an event of various students presenting their take on the importance of our democratic Constitution, and the need for us to vigilantly protect it against threats. This will be a demonstration in student civic awareness and in what the Greeks called "civic virtue". Look for an announcement in the first three weeks of Spring Quarter about this. Faculty and staff, please help us with this by adjusting your teaching and syllabi to include such student participation. Then recommend students to your campus *Save Our Democracy* Committee. Thank you.

- 2. <u>Spring Quarter Student Contributions</u>: showcasing of student work depicting the threat to our democracy. One student's work in the following categories shall be showcased: poem, short

- essay, picture, apparel design, spoken word, dance, and desktop publishing. Time for Q/A at the end and ideas on how students can contribute to next quarter's activity.
- 3. <u>Fall Quarter Voter Education and Mobilization</u>: a host of associations involved in voter education and mobilization will provide students ways of informing those in their spheres of influence of the importance of the 2024 election and to participate electorally.
