
St. Catherine University '24-25 Voter Engagement Plan

Civic Engagement Collective

The Civic Engagement Collective is a group of faculty, staff and students that promotes civic engagement to our university community. We want to ensure members of the university community know how to register to vote, where to vote and are fully informed about the candidates and issues with the goal to create a vibrant, engaging and respectful political climate during the election cycle. We also focus on the importance of civic engagement beyond elections and work to promote opportunities for engagement, discussion and learning. The Collective has monthly meetings.

The St. Kate's Civic Engagement Fellowship

The St. Kate's Civic Engagement Fellowship (SCEF) is a fellowship that allows St. Kate's to promote civic engagement. Student fellows collaboratively lead project-based efforts to engage our campus community in democratic/civic education and practices.

Students apply to be part of a cohort of fellows focused on civic engagement and social justice. Fellows work together to encourage the community to be civically engaged. They participate in training and get support in developing their leadership skills to create and facilitate activities. We use Campus Compact's "Social Change Wheel" as a guiding structure.

Goal: Develop and support student leadership in the civic realm to co-create a nonpartisan civically engaged campus through education, dialogue, and action – providing spaces where everyone's voice is heard through full participation in democracy.



Strategies

Inclusion and Accessibility

Create culturally responsive and collaborative materials/programming based on the needs of our diverse campus communities, including online students, multilingual students, 1st generation, etc.

Consider and prioritize voter access issues that influence students, and implement ongoing, diverse and clear messaging, educate transportation options and support all forms of voting.

Education

Promote upcoming election dates and update voter information through printed media, email communication, digital media and tabling—including by providing:

- Voter resources during Tuesday tabling in the Coeur de Catherine
- Digital resources and social media campaigns - collaboration with Publication Design course
- Democracy and civic engagement events
- Workshops, lectures and discussions
- Democracy walls

Collaboration, Communication & Outreach

Partner with internal and external entities that support our civic engagement efforts, and promote voting education and access to reach all constituents.

Promote & Disseminate Voting Pledge/Plan

Strengthen communications on voter resources

- o Specific email about voting to all students, faculty and staff
- o Specific email about voting to resident students
- o Regular tabling with voting resources
- o Highlight voter resources in student newsletters
- o Flier campus with voter info
- o Increased social media presence

Educate about elected offices, from local to national, roles they play

- o Expand knowledge about roles of elected officials within different government offices/branches to have more informed voters, deeper understanding of what decision making power, impact of different offices
- o Promote a variety of educational resources for civic knowledge building
 - Connect students and Sisters of St. Joseph / Carondelet Village for intergenerational learning
 - Promote nonpartisan external forums
 - Increase efforts to direct students to nonpartisan education on issues, policies
