
Campus

UCSF is committed to encouraging civic participation throughout our campus and community. With increased interest in advocacy at UCSF, elections present us with an opportunity to increase engagement and empower our community. The University of California is equally committed to increasing voter engagement on campus and signed a MOU to meet certain requirements with the Secretary of State in 2016.

Launched in the summer of 2019, the UCSF Voter Engagement Work Group is charged with discussing campus-wide efforts, coordinating communication strategies, and strategizing voter engagement events at UCSF for students, staff, faculty, alumni and our greater community.

UCSF has authorized the National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE) and will receive campus voting data for the 2024 election in fall 2025. Our NSLVE authorization runs through 2033.

#### Goals:

Our institution's nonpartisan democratic engagement goals are:

- Increase student voter turnout rate to 90% in 2024 (89.9% in 2020).
- Increase student voter registration rate to 88% in 2024 (86.4% in 2020).

## Strategy:

To increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter participation, the UCSF Voter Engagement Workgroup has developed a toolkit of messaging and collateral which is shared across campus and health center to promote voter registration and voter turnout. ## **Evaluation:**

UCSF will evaluate our action plan in the following ways:

- Reviewing our National, Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement data to evaluate
  the increase of student voting by comparing our campus voter turnout and voter
  registration rates to past elections to measure progress on increasing both.
- Holding a workgroup debrief meeting after each election cycle to discuss what worked well and areas of improvement for the next cycle.
