Executive Summary:

This nonpartisan democratic engagement action plan was developed by University of Redlands in California for the 2024 election. The purpose of this action plan is to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter registration, education, and turnout in the 2024 election. The goal for University of Redlands for the 2024 election is to create an environment where students feel empowered to engage in civic activities, including voter registration, educational sessions on the democratic process, and voter participation initiatives.

The group meets weekly and maintains engagement through regular updates, collaborative planning sessions, and delegating responsibilities for events. We also have support from upper administration, ensuring access to resources and venues.

Commitment:

University of Redlands does not have a current signatory to the ALL IN Presidents' Commitment to Full Student Voter Participation. The University of Redlands is deeply committed to fostering a culture of civic engagement. Through the efforts of the Civic Engagement Committee, we are confident that we will continue to create meaningful opportunities for students to learn about and participate in the democratic process. With our short-term and long-term goals, we aim to increase voter registration, encourage thoughtful civic participation, and build a robust coalition of faculty, staff, and students dedicated to promoting civic empowerment on campus.

Landscape:

University of Redlands is a private 4-year institution and joined the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge in 2021. Our institution is designated as the following: Minority-Serving Institution, Hispanic-Serving Institution.

Our campus demographic and voting data:

University of Redlands has 4,566 students.

University of Redlands has authorized the National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE) and will receive campus voting data for the 2022 election in fall 2023. Our NSLVE authorization runs through 2033.

We have initiated strategies through events, tabling efforts, and digital engagement campaigns. To increase voter registration and engagement, we have launched a series of activities, including tabling events at New Student Orientation and the Involvement Fair, voter registration campaigns, and digital and printed flyer distributions.

Goals:

Our institution's nonpartisan democratic engagement goals are:

Short-term (2-year) Goals:

- Increase student voter registration and turnout by 20% through targeted campaigns.
- Establish a campus-wide coalition dedicated to civic engagement and voter education.
- Revive the "Bulldogs Vote" student group and working collaboratively with the Redlands Student Government to increase awareness on the importance of voting.
- Expand our event programming to include at least three civic engagement events per semester, such as debate watch parties, Constitution Day celebrations, and educational workshops on the democratic process.
- Establish a comprehensive, dedicated Campus Civic Engagement website.
- Introducing presentations on the importance of voting by faculty members.

Long-term (5-year) Goals:

- Achieve a voter registration rate of 80% among eligible students.
- Institutionalize civic engagement as a core component of the University of Redlands experience through regular events and curriculum integration.
- Strengthen the Bulldogs Vote! group and create a sustainable leadership pipeline to ensure continuity.
- Establish a strong collaboration between the Civic Engagement Committee and local election offices, voter advocacy groups, other education institutions, and the California Secretary of State's Office.

Strategy:

University of Redlands will implement these strategies to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and student voter participation.

- September 10, 2024: Presidential Debate Watch Party and Q&A Session.
- **September 17, 2024**: Constitution Day and National Voter Registration Day (included distribution of the U.S. Constitution in English and Spanish).
- September 29, 2024: Workshop on "The ART of Inclusive Communication" in collaboration with the NCRC and the Title IX Office.
- October 1, 2024: Vice Presidential Debate Watch Party and Q&A Session, followed by a voter registration drive.

- October 14, 2024: Lecture by Dr. Adrian D. Pantoja on "The Importance of Voting in 2024 and Beyond."
- **AY 2024 2025**: Civic Empowerment Workshop, tabling, information resources, focusing on voter rights and the democratic process including communications.
- Sustained Dialogue Events: October November 2024 (schedule below)

Each event is designed to build a culture of civic engagement on campus, with a focus on educating students about the importance of participating in the democratic process and providing them with the tools to do so. We will continue to monitor and adjust our plans based on event turnout and feedback from participants.

Evaluation:

We will evaluate our action plan in the following ways:


University of Redlands will use the National, Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement to evaluate the increase of student voting by comparing our campus voter turnout and voter registration rates to past elections to measure progress on increasing both.
