

## Washington College's 2024 Commitment to Active Participation in Our Democracy

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Development of the plan:

- The Washington College Civic Engagement Coalition is made up of student representatives, faculty and community stakeholders. This election season we will increase motivation among our student body in 2024 by increasing voter registration, addressing political apathy, while also maintaining a commitment to ensuring both voting accessibility and equity at the polls.

Purpose of plan:

- The purpose of the plan is to have comprehensive, organized, actionable steps to encourage maximum voter turnout for the 2024 elections and continue cultivating a culture of civic engagement more broadly with both the college and campus-community.

Previous Efforts:

In association with the Starr Center for the American Experience, Dr. Patrick Nugent conducted a program entitled, "Student leaders in Civic Engagement" or (S.L.I.C.E). This program took a class in conjunction with the Maryland Board of Electors to become eligible to register individuals to vote in the state of Maryland and elsewhere. Additionally, the team was able to personally invite local government candidates from Kent County, MD in order to host a candidate forum at Washington College. The facilitation of diverse conversation rela-time allowed students to better grasp the severity of various issues. The goal is to apply similar initiatives to the 2024 election campaign.

2024 Action Plan Goals:

- We utilized data from the 2022 Midterm Election gathered by NSLVE to serve as the baseline for our 2024 election goals. These goals are:

- Ensure a 25% voter registration increase across the student-body
- Schedule four or more voter registration tabling events across September and October
- Coordinate a multitude of education events/speaker engagements
- Organize trips/conferences that are open to the student body
- Create a web of stakeholder engagement (community, faculty, clubs, athletics, affinity groups)
- Establish a visual voter engagement campaign both on campus and on social media platforms (Instagram and Campus Groups).

Timeline Plan:

-The intended duration of the plan will be from May 2024 through November 2024. The plan will be implemented throughout the year and evaluated/adjusted to see if our initial goals have been met.

Implementation of Plan:

- The Action Plan would be implemented by the Voter Engagement Interns in association with the Student Affairs department and the Starr Center for the American Experience.
